SCAT? "SCAT" is the short form of SCAT Street Cat Rescue Program Inc. It is a registered charity and non-profit organization that is run by volunteers who have been saving and bettering feline lives since 1997.

Volunteers monitor colonies of feral cats (wild cats with little or no contact with humans) and use TNR (Trap Neuter Return) to help naturally deplete the cat population living on the streets.

Kittens, both feral and social, are placed in foster homes for socialization and adoption. Lost or abandoned social adult cats are fostered and are available for adoption after placing found ads and contacting local lost listings in an effort to find their original homes.

Unsuccessful Traditional Method

The Trap & Kill method has been traditionally used to eliminate cats from an area, ignoring the usefulness of a cat as nature's rodent control. However, this method has been proven unsuccessful primarily because if food sources are not removed from the area, then even if cats are trapped and re-

moved, other animals will move in to eat the available food.

TNR - Trap Neuter Return

TNR has been used successfully throughout the world. Adult feral cats are tested for disease, vaccinated, identified with tattoos and microchips and spayed or neutered. They are then returned to their original area so that they will continue to guard their food source and discourage other unvaccinated and intact animals from taking up residence. It will dramatically cut down on the problems that bother human members of our community, such as males fighting for mating, and it will eliminate additional kittens being born onto the streets, and thereby depleting the at-large feral cat population.

Cost Effective

Trap & Kill programs are expensive and must be repeated as new animals move into the area. TNR program colonies are maintained and monitored by volunteer caregivers, costing the tax payers nothing. Donations are used to run the TNR program.

Community Spirit

TNR decreases the street animal population humanely, monitors the health of the street cats, and promotes community spirit by involving members of the community in a very humane and community minded project.
